



## Audiometry Basics Workshop

### About the workshop

This 1-day, in-company workshop provides efficient, hands-on training for small groups in the basic skills required to conduct hearing tests on adults, primarily within general practice and health assessment organisations.

- How many of your nurses/practitioners have had formal training in this specialised area?
- How confident are they in conducting tests, inspecting ears and presenting results to patients?
- When the test isn't going to plan, or the patient isn't responding "properly", what do you do?

During this workshop students will learn how to conduct audiometry, perform otoscopy and manage the numerous elements that can affect the accuracy of hearing test results.

Conducting a hearing test looks simple enough however there is more going on than meets the eye. In fact, research reveals that formal training produces accuracy, competence and confidence in practitioners. In turn, this can enhance the quality and reputation of the service provider.

The course combines theory and practical training in a compact format, utilising a range of teaching methods and materials including:
